In spite of the difficult and trying conditions the Board is attempting to meet the needs of our membership within the constraints of TYC's finances.


• The rules and by-laws are not part of the roster anymore and will be published this month on our website in the members section.



Ahoy Everyone,

Plenty of water at the Club !!!

These high lake levels are frustrating !!

I'll keep my report informational rather than express my views about Lake Ontario water levels......

• New 30 Amp twist lock receptacles were installed everywhere replacing the 20a ones. Please don't force 20a plugs in the 30a receptacles.

• Wiring problems have been occurring this season, whether that's a sign of the age of the system or the high water Steve Clark's electrician has taken care of them as they come up.

- Docks I-84/85 and I-86/87 have been moved, affording better use of the space
- New Water Lines and Ball valves have been installed everywhere at the club except the east wall; I am hoping to complete that section sometime later this season.
- TYC purchased pilings in the offseason, and to date have been installed all along the north wall and many on the south side of the Club. I'm planning to replace more Pilings this fall after mast removal.


