Next year is looking promising with new docks in Haines and building-up of the end of the island and road.





While the Board has been as efficient as possible in its operation of the Club and has tried to keep expenses as low as possible, it has been difficult to off-set the loss of members and dockage from the year before. Sandy and Jeff Jordan and the other membership committee members have done a tremendous effort in recruiting new members but if we want to keep rate down, we as members, must attract new blood to the Club.

### Fleet Captain ~ Jeff Jordan





After a great boating season our boats are now on the hard for a winter's rest.

High water gave some of us another challenge this year trying to get to our boats.

With this being said, Steve Clark has informed us that he will be doing infrastructure repairs to the Island along with replacing Haine's docks with floaters for the 2020 boating season. Details to follow.

Once this configuration has been finalized by our landlord and our Board of Directors, the slip layout will be posted.

As many of you know we started the year with 16 docking members who did not renew their slips for 2019. This equated to an approximate \$28,000 deficit in dockage fees and dues. Keep in mind we need to maintain a minimum of 3250 feet in docked boat feet to satisfy our present yearly lease. We dipped below this number at the beginning of the year but have worked hard to see this number increase.

#### For a comparison in:

- 2018 Actual TYC Boat Feet Docked 3507.78'
- 2019 Presently we have 3365.08' Boat Feet Docked.
- This year we had approximately 131 usable slips due to high water. We utilized 109 of them.
- Currently we have 24 docks available. When the Haines floating docks are installed this number will increase.

As the season comes to an end, we have 5 new available slips as a result of members moving onto the next chapter in their lives. These new available slips are posted on our website.

If you would like to change your slip, it is very easy to submit a Slip Change Request.

- Fill out the form and Click Submit.
- I will notify you that your request has been received.

If a slip becomes available at any time during the year, the details of the slip will be posted on the Club's Website and an Email notification will be sent out to all members.

I have some November reminders for our members.

- Any dock uprights that extend into the water must be removed by the slip renting member by November 15th in order to prevent damage to the dock. Members failing to do so will be assessed a fine of \$25.00.
- Dock Reservations are due before November 15th of this year. By doing this before November 15th you can avoid the \$25.00 late fee.
- November is also the month that you can vote for the new candidates that will act on your behalf for the next 2 years. Ballots will be mailed by November 15th. You have until December 1st to return your ballot to the designated teller.


In closing, we had another safe and efficient haul out. I noticed more members tying their ladders off and working safely while performing tasks to store their boats for the winter.
