If a slip becomes available at any time during the year, the details of the slip will be posted on the Club's Website and an Email notification will be sent out to all members. Available slips will be posted on the TYC clubhouse bulletin board between launch and haul out. If a member would like to request a slip or request a slip change it is very simple. Just fill out the Slip Request / Swap Form on our website. As in the past, those members wishing to store their dinghies in the parking lot must fill out the online Dinghy Reservation Form on our website. Note, we have 12 spaces available on a first come basis. There is no charge for dinghy storage. Members may also store their boat

trailers in the upper parking lot from May 1st through October 1st for an \$81.00 tax included fee. This request must be made by filling out the online Trailer Storage Request form on our website. I would like to thank those who submitted their dock reservation contract and proof of insurance certificates. If you have not done so, please send them to me ASAP. Boating Report

The 2023 Boating Season is underway and the first TYC Club Cruise to NOTL Yacht Club was a couple of weeks ago. The border is now fully reopened and a cruise to Canada is fun, easy and convenient. However, there are certain reporting requirements that must be followed if you decide to cruise to Canada and return to the US. Please read the following information before embarking on your cruise and visit the website links for more information.

Pleasure Boats - Requirements for entering Canada:

Once in Canadian waters, you must follow the rules that govern safety equipment, the safe operation of your pleasure craft, and protection of the environment that apply in Canada. Watch for boating restrictions such as speed limits or vessel prohibitions. Visitors entering Canada by boat should visit the Canada Border Services Agency for more information on Customs procedures. If you will be entering Canada from the United States using a private pleasure craft, you may be interested in the <u>NEXUS</u> program.

Pleasure Boats - Requirements for entering the United States:

Boaters looking for a quick way to report their arrival and/or apply for a registered boater program may use the CBP ROAM app. The app is available at no charge on the Apple App and Google Play stores. Boaters may continue to report their arrival using designated telephone reporting numbers, if necessary.

All operators of a non-commercial small vessel/pleasure boat must report immediately to the nearest U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) port of entry upon arrival to the United States from a foreign port or place, including the U.S. Virgin Islands. CBP has designated specific reporting locations for pleasure boats to report their arrival and be inspected by a CBP officer.

The master of the boat will be directed to the nearest port of entry to satisfy the face-to-face requirement, or report to the nearest designated reporting location along with the boat's passengers for inspection. A U.S. pleasure craft and a foreign-flag vessel without a cruising license (30 feet or longer in length) must pay an annual decal user fee of \$27.50. User Fee Decals may be purchased online through the Decal Transponder Online Procurement System – DTOPS. The master of the boat will be directed to the nearest port of entry to satisfy the face-to-face requirement, or report to the nearest designated reporting location along with the boat's passengers for inspection. A U.S. pleasure craft and a foreign-flag vessel 30 feet or longer in length, must pay an annual decal user fee of \$27.50. User Fee Decals may be purchased online through the Dot System – DTOPS. The Small Vessel Reporting System (SVRS) is no longer in service and float plans will no longer be accepted.
