Planning is underway to make this year's haul-out run as efficiently and safely as in previous years. We have a couple of new boats that have not been stored with us in the past that must be considered. Please understand that many factors come into play when positioning boats on the island—length, width, cradle location, and especially weight when setting up some larger boats. We try to put boats at the closest location to the dock, but depending on crane ability and cradle location, we may ask you to move your boat to the spot where the crane crew can safely get your boat out of the water. In that case, you have to be ready to move your boat. We highly recommend not winterizing your boat before hauling it out. You must be confident your boat can move per the crane operator's request. I believe I am up to date with our existing members and the addition of our new members planning to haul and store with us. If any

members hauled and stored with us last year who are not planning on doing so this year, please let me know as soon as possible.

This year's haul-out activity dates:

Saturday, September 23, 2023 - Cradle placement - 7 AM to completion Sunday, September 24, 2023 - Cradle placement - 7 AM if required. Saturday, September 30, 2023 - Mast removal, Boom Truck, Gin Pole - 7 AM to completion. (Please note: Boom Track Crew and Gin Pole Crew work only on Saturday, September 30) Saturday, October 7, 2023 - Haul Out - 7 AM to dark Sunday, October 8, 2023 – Haul Out - 7 AM to completion (Please note: Columbus Day is observed on October 9, 2023)

Peter Hubbell will lead the Cradle Crew.

Mike Algase will lead the Crane Crew and Boom Truck Crew. Dan Manhardt and Doug Klapper will lead the Gin Pole Crew.

A friendly reminder for everyone planning to store with us:

- Do you have a Cradle, and is it marked with your Name, Slip #, Bow, and Stern?
- Do you have proper Jack Stands and plywood to go under the stands?
- Do you have sufficient blocking for your boat?

"Your stewards make it so easy to get into a slip."


"You have such great facilities!"

What's Different About Fall Boating? On-Water Safety Tips

Plus, a deep dive into choosing your winter boat cover from the nonprofit BoatUS Foundation

For some boaters, fall is the best time for boating. Summer's steamy days have surrendered to more comfortable temperatures, angling improves, and winds are stronger for sailing. It's also time to embrace extra boating safety efforts for the season and look ahead to how you're going to store your boat this winter. The nonprofit BoatUS Foundation for Boating Safety and Clean Water has some boating safety tips to consider, some maintenance reminders, as well as some test results on the four main types of winter boat covers.

Take safety seriously: If you ask the U.S. Coast Guard about boating safety and drowning, they'll tell you that three of every four boaters who drowned in 2022 were using vessels less than 21 feet in length at the time (when boat length was known in the <u>accident statistics</u>). The BoatUS Foundation says that small boats in particular are more susceptible to the effects of stormy weather. During leaf-peeping season there's also more solo boat operation, which means it's wise to wear a life jacket and file a float plan so someone can raise the alarm if you fail to return. A self-boarding ladder, such as a length of multi-looped rope anchored to a cleat, should be easily grabbable from the water.

Keep up with maintenance: Like many boaters, enjoying summer boating season was primary. Secondary was toiling over the things that broke, leaked or came apart. Ensuring your vessel remains reliable is important as there are fewer potential good Samaritan boaters – generally your closest rescuers – to provide help, if necessary.

Look for a winter boat cover: Have you ever considered using a reusable winter cover instead of shrinkwrap? The BoatUS Foundation recently put a number of common boat storage covers to the test. Some findings include: "Waterproof" and "water-resistant" covers are not the same; boats on rack storage may have no other choice than shrink-wrap due to safety reasons; and ensuring all-winter-long survival of any type of boat cover includes making sure the cover is well-supported and adding padding to a boat's hard edges and tops of all cover support poles. The full report, <u>Foundation Findings #60: What You Need to Know About</u> <u>Boat Covers for Winter Storage</u>, can help boaters fairly evaluate reusable, more environmentally friendly options.
