



NEW HOME STUDY BOATING COURSE

It is with pleasure that the Lockport Power Squadron (LPS) offers a brand new computer home-study course designed to hone boaters knowledge of water safety and boating skills. This course has been under cooperative development by the national USPS organization and the United States Coast Guard for several years and, after much testing, was made available last December. The course is designed primarily for the many boaters who cannot find time to attend the class-room boating courses held regularly by local power squadrons and coast guard auxiliaries . It consists of a CD (and a text) which can be programmed on virtually any home computer. Completion of the various lessons is entirely at the pace of the student. The Lockport Power Squadron is experienced in offering class-room courses in all aspects of boating skills and we greet this new course with great enthusiasm. The course material is extremely well-done and we regard the course as a major break-through in boating education. When the student has completed the course and mastered the material, a proctored exam is given by the LPS. Course completion meets the New York state requirements for jet-ski operation and in most cases, qualifies the student for a discount in insurance rates. As of this writing, almost thirty of the course packages have been sold by LPS and we are in the process of organizing regular exam periods so that students may find it convenient to complete the course. Many of the courses have gone to families, where all members (including children) will study the material. The courses sell for \$30 with the exam being offered free. The LPS wishes to encourage wide usage, so our pricing policy provides that all immediate members of a family which has purchased a package may take the exam free. We know that the CD will be burned and distributed, and this is also encouraged. For the sum of \$10, anyone who has taken the course from someone else's CD can also take the proctored exam.



VESSEL SAFETY CHECKS

The United States Coast Guard has delegated their courtesy boat safety checks to the USPS and there are several qualified inspectors available to the Tuscarora Yacht Club. One is in the WYC and at least two others are in TYC. These inspections are entirely voluntary and no report is made of failed exams; the owner is provided with a list of deficiencies for upgrading as they see fit. Further, the inspections must be requested - noone will be approached to have their boat inspected. Inspections can be scheduled by contacting Pat Lockwood or Frank Scannapieco at TYC or Al Leach at WYC, who will either make an inspection or arrange to have it done by one of the other inspectors. This is an excellent way to start off the boating season; make sure that your boat meets all the requirements for safe operation on Lake Ontario.

REAR COMMODORE'S REPORT


DIRECTOR OF HARBOR OPERATIONS REPORT

I also certify that I have appropriate liability insurance.

I understand that participation in races may require serving as race committee (first-year WHYRA members are generally exempted from this duty).

A registration fee of \$55 is enclosed (\$60 after April 15). I understand that a current PHRF certificate must be on file with the PHRF handicapper and dues must be received by a WHYRA committee member before any race will be officially scored.
